Certification and Agreement for HEERF III- American Recovery Act (ARA) Funds

Community Christian College acknowledges that they have signed and returned the official Certification and Agreement for CARES Act funds to the US Department of Education – which serves as formal acknowledgment and acceptance of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) funds under Section 314(a)(1).and subsequently funds awarded American Recovery Act (ARA) funds under Section 2003(a) (1).

Total Funds Received

Community Christian College has received Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA for a total of \$56,987 and \$125,928 in total funds pursuant to the institution’s Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students, from the American Recovery Act (ARA) funds under Section 2003(a) (1). The total combined funds received were 182,915.

Eligible Students for Fall

The estimated total number of students at Community Christian College eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 2003(a) (1) of the ARA Grant on Oct 14, 2021 was 581.

Number of Grants Awarded

Community Christian College has awarded 87 of the 106 student applications received grants under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA and Section 2003(a) (1) of the ARA Grant.

Amount of Grants Awarded

The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants awarded and disbursed to students under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA and Section S2003(a) (1) of the ARA Act in this quarter was \$87,000.

The institution has used the entire allocation under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA and Section S2003(a) (1) of the ARA Act as of January 10, 2022, is \$182, 915.

In addition, the school allocated \$76,158 of Institutional grant funding towards awarding student emergency grants.

Application & Awarding Process

Qualifying Students

All currently enrolled students are eligible and must be an active student on day of disbursement.

Outreach Method

Email, with link to secure online form indicating need was sent to student group identified above.

Award Methodology

To support the opportunity for the student body to receive relief funds and prioritize those with higher need, \$1000 awards were granted to those who applied and certified their need.

Disbursement

Grants were mailed to student via paper check or posted to student account at students request after receipt of student's acknowledgement and written consent.

Communication

Information for the grant and the application was communicated via email to all currently enrolled students.
