Greetings Everyone!

I say this all the time to the staff, faculty, and board members and it is appropriate to state it here too, "God is good all the time and all the time, God is good." Another Fall quarter is passing, and the Winter quarter will be upon us shortly here at Community Christian College (cCc). The cCc mission is to provide a Christian worldview throughout our curriculum to inner-city youth and we are doing it incredibly well at the moment. The Department of Education has recognized us as a minority-serving institution. We are almost 97% minority, and our staff and faculty are mostly doctorate degree individuals that are as diverse as our student body. In addition, we have an over 70% transfer rate.

We are very excited that we have retained many of the 501 students that started this Fall. A true success story for us since our remodeling process was complete five years ago. This newsletter is a prelude to the publication of our first Annual Report which will be out shortly. Now that we are financially sound and have achieved another 10-year reaffirmation accreditation with TRACS, we are on our way to long-term success. We have raised the equity on the balance sheet from a negative number five years ago to roughly four million dollars today.

With the introduction of our affiliation with several sports organizations offering their programs in conjunction with our online AA degree program, we have had much success. Now add to this the college's own venture into offering sports teams, our college continues to grow. We now have two NJCAA Div 1 teams. One program, "The Saints," is located in Redlands at the main campus and one set of teams, "The Lions," is located in Detroit at our college-owned online support center. Success has continued to shine upon cCc.

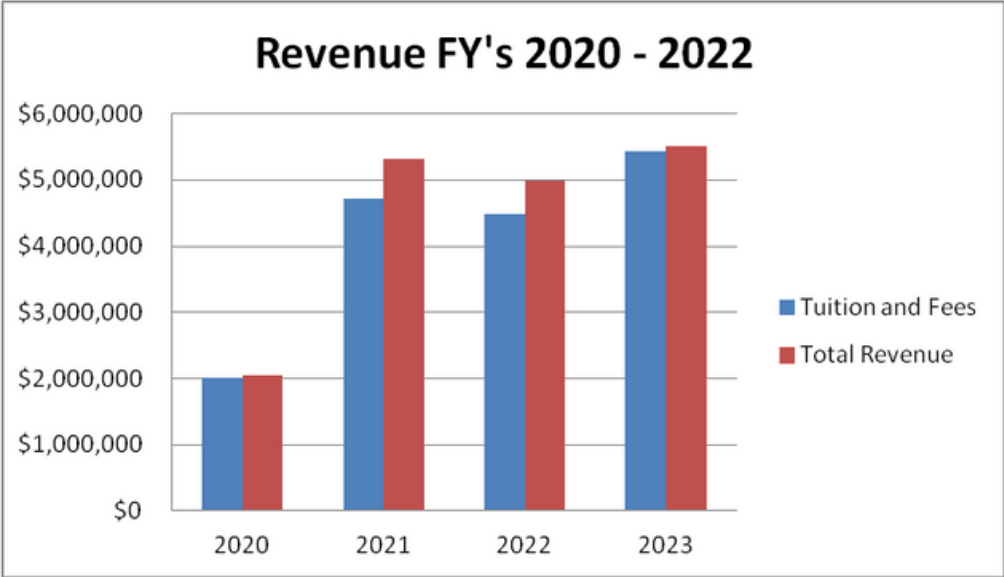

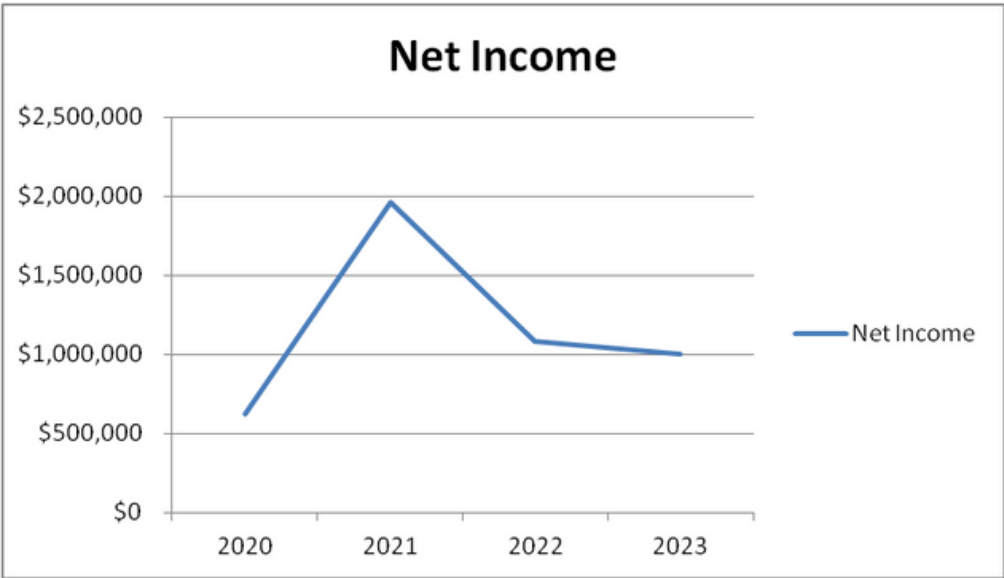

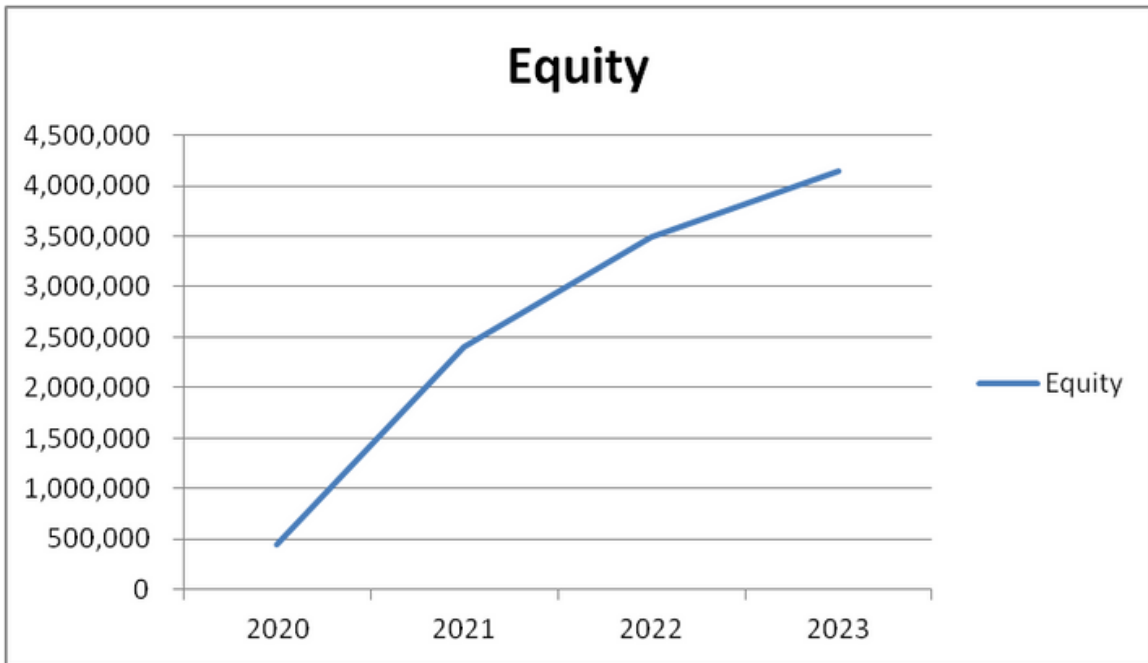
This graph shows how cCc's revenue growth from 2020 until 2022 with a 2023 forecast.



This graph shows how many net income growth from 2020 until 2022 with a 2023 forecast.

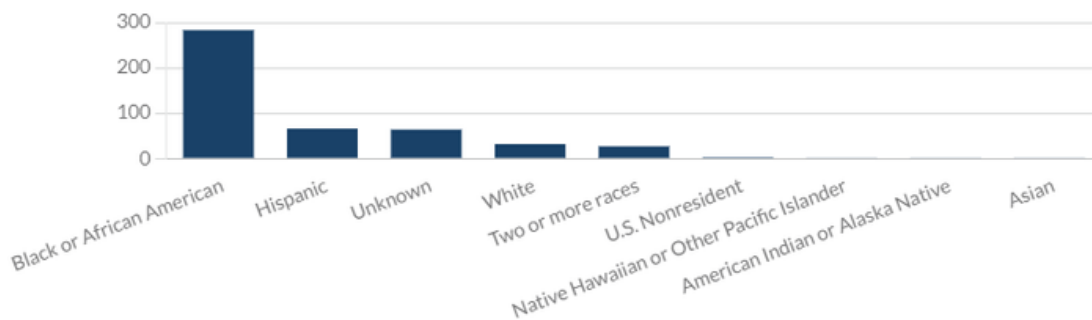


This graph shows how cCc is reinvesting in itself after many years of negative equity. We are well on the way to being self-sustaining.

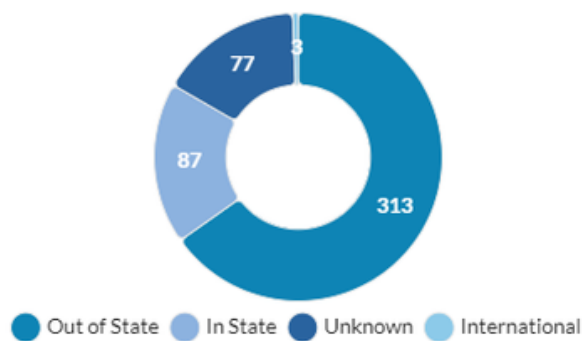


The following shows the make-up of our student body for the Fall 2022 Enrollments.

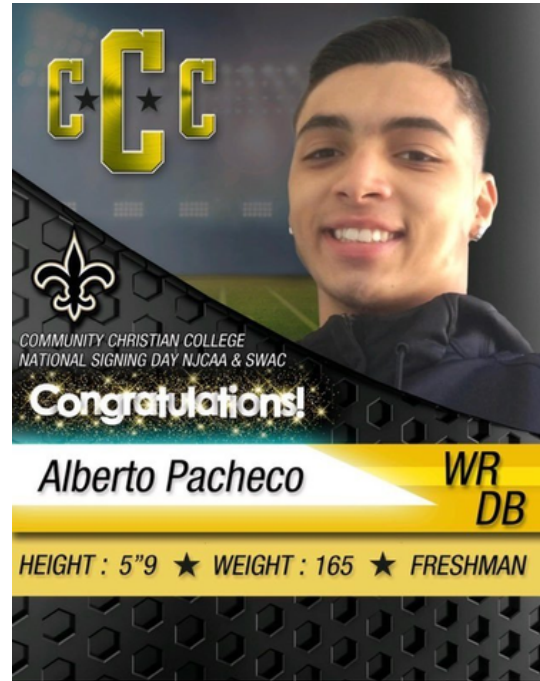

Ronnie Jerome Ghent is a former American football fullback and former head coach of the Central Florida Jaguars of American Indoor Football (AIF). He was signed by the Philadelphia Eagles as an undrafted free agent in 2004. He played college football at Louisville. Ghent has also been a member of the Cincinnati Bengals, New Orleans Saints, New York Sentinels and Hartford Colonials.

The Jacksonville Athletic Academy was established in 2020 by former NFL player Nolan Carroll II and his brother Necho Carroll. Nolan Carroll II, a native of Jacksonville, Florida, attended the University of Maryland, where he was drafted by the Miami Dolphins and later played for the Philadelphia Eagles and Dallas Cowboys.
